Scholars with an applied focus who study children and families at risk are particularly encouraged to apply. Successful candidates will be expected to demonstrate a sophisticated understanding of multiple methods of scholarship in child and family studies. The successful candidate will be expected to continue an active research agenda, including seeking funding from competitive federal and private agencies, in addition to participating in the Department's undergraduate and graduate teaching and advising programs. Candidates must have an earned doctoral degree in Human Development, Family Studies or a closely related field. Women and minorities are encouraged to apply. Salary and benefits are competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.
